A PROCESS, OUTCOME AND COST STUDY OF TWO OREGON FAMILY DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

Marion County Fostering Attachment
Treatment Court
(Implemented January 2006)

Jackson County Community Family Court (Implemented July 2001)

This study was conducted through funding from the Bureau of Justice Assistance (Byrne) and the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission



A PROCESS, OUTCOME AND COST STUDY OF TWO OREGON FAMILY DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

- Sample of drug court participants who entered over two-year time period
- Matched sample of parents with dependency cases

Demographics, age at first use, # of children, ages of children, prior tx, prior criminal history

- Tracked drug & alcohol treatment, child welfare and criminal justice recidivism
 - Two years in Marion
 - Four years in Jackson




Do FDTC parents stay in treatment longer than non-FDTC parents?

(JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. In the year after drug court entry, the FDTC program parents spent nearly twice as long in treatment than parents who did not participate in the program.

Days in Outpatient Drug Treatment






Do FDTC parents complete treatment more often than non-FDTC parents?

(JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. Significantly more FDTC program parents successfully completed treatment after program entry compared to parents who did not participate in the FDTC.

Percent of Parents that Successfully Completed a Treatment Episode






Do children of parents who participate in FDTC spend less time in foster care?

(MARION COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. Children of FDTC parents spent significantly less time in foster care in the 2 years after drug court entry than children of non-FATC parents.







Are FTC children returned to their parents more quickly after drug court start? (MARION COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. Children whose parents participated in the FATC program were returned in less than half the time than children whose parents did not participate.






Are FDTC parents reunified with their children more often?

(MARION COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. FDTC parents were reunified with their children significantly more often while experiencing significantly fewer adoptions and termination of parental rights.






Jackson County 51% for drug court, 45% for comparison



Do FDC parents have fewer subsequent arrests than non-FDC parents?

(JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON)

YES. Drug court participants were re-arrested significantly less often than the comparison group over 4 years from drug court entry.

Of the total investment cost 45% was paid for treatment, 30% for DHS (foster care).





Of the total investment cost 31% is for treatment, 21% for services for the child with the parent, 20% DHS.

DHS had 58% of the total savings (of agencies that had savings) Corrections had next highest with 20% - Same with Marion



Outcome Costs per Participant (Criminal Justice, Treatment and Child Welfare)

Cost savings after 2 years was

Marion = \$13,104

Jackson = \$5,593

per FDTC participant



Summary and Cost-Benefit Ratio MARION COUNTY

Marion Co. (2 years)

- A 130% return on its investment after 2 years (a 1:1.3 cost-benefit ratio)
- A projected 330% return on its investment after 5 years (a 1:3.3 cost-benefit ratio)

Jackson Co (4 years)

A projected 106% return on its investment after 5 years (a 1:1.06 cost-benefit ratio)

Note: Marion had direct services for children and family
